Program Update	 Fire alarm was malfunctioning. Issue is now fixed 51of 52 units filled Tenants come with supports I.EAlouette Addictions, Coast Mental Health Outreach, Salvation Army, Fraser Health Indigenous Society, Friends In Need Food Bank working with us by providing in-house delivery. Garibaldi Ridge currently has three dogs and two cats registered. Sprott Shaw practicum student placements to start in November/December BC Housing has provided funding to have a nurse 7-days a week. Right now we only have a nurse 5-days a weeks and we are still waiting for a weekend nurse. We are able to partner with a GP provided by Wilson Pharmacy. The GP is on site every Wednesday for 3 hours. GP provides drug replacement therapy. Three tenants are on drug replacement therapy. Programs & Groups-Interview Process & Resume Building, Honorariums (Clean Team & Breakfast), Life Skills and Education Based groups. Successes: Challenging and often physically aggressive tenants are more comfortable with their new surrounding and integrating better with other tenants and showing more interest in programming to support their recovery.
