Chloe Goodison is the Founder & Executive Director of NaloxHome Society, a Registered Charity that provides free, youth-run drug education and naloxone training in Canadian Secondary schools. NaloxHome Society also runs outreach programs in Vancouver, including warm clothing drives, hygiene donation programs, and meal distributions.

Chloe is a student in the Faculty of Health Sciences at Simon Fraser University, where she is completing her BSc. in Public Health & Data with a Certificate in Entrepreneurship & Innovation through the SFU Chang Institute for Entrepreneurship. In 2024, Chloe was a recipient of the BCBusiness 30 Under 30 and the Surrey Board of Trade 25 Under 25. Chloe was also nationally recognized by Mazda Canada in 2023 with one of five Canadian "Rising Legends" awards. Due to her innovation in social entrepreneurship as a young person, Chloe has been featured in international media.

A proud resident of Port Moody, BC, Chloe can be found coaching girls' soccer with Port Moody Soccer Club in her free time or playing on a recreational team with Urban Rec Vancouver.
