	Coast Member: Reviewed enhanced security measures, de-	
	activation of FOBs requiring staff only granted access to tenants	
	at 10pm; review of guest policy; and that only tenants are	
	permitted to use within the tent that is provided on site. This	
	facility doesn't provide a community-run OPS.	
	Committee Member: Commented that it was unexpected to	
	hear that tenants did not want children to see substance use.	

Questioned if the intention was to move the OPS tent to the rear of the building.

Coast Member: We are working with BC Housing on the scope to move tent to the rear, which will require electrical for lighting and camera, and confirmed that there is a camera within the current OPS tent.

Coast Member: Reviewed harm reduction approach in the provision of supplies as an opportunity to review safer use, and mentioned that we currently house three individuals on site who are not active in any substance use.

Coast Member: Reviewed programming to date. Celebrated Mental Health Week. Facilitated a Fire Safety presentation by Assistant Chief-Fire Rescue at Staff Meeting who will be presenting Fire Safety in-service to Rivers Reach tenants at an upcoming tenant meeting; we also want to demonstrate to our neighbours that as part of the community we will be implementing a Street Clean Team for Fraser Street, tenants will go up and down Fraser Street to pick up any garbage or drug paraphernalia. We are being mindful that this may be associated with guest behaviour and/or individuals trying to access the site and not the actions of tenants. We are also planning to launch a gardening, cooking skills program and in discussions with our Peer Support Specialist also looking for ways that tenants can contribute to the community – which may be volunteering to prep and serve a meal at the Salvation Army as one potential example, something we had done at another site in Maple Ridge. All frontline staff at RR are tasked with facilitating a PSR (psycho social rehabilitation) program to support life skills development, in addition to leisure activities.
